# Illness, Allergy Season and Medication Reminders *Illness*

As you know this year's cold and flu season has been severe. We appreciate your diligence in monitoring your child's health and wellness. As a reminder, ECS cannot permit any student with a fever of 100.4 or higher. In addition, a child must be fever free for 24 hours without medication before returning to school. If your child is absent for 3 or more days due to illness, you must submit a doctor's note before returning to school. Due to the increase in flu and other illnesses, we would encourage parents to have their child examined by a doctor if they are exhibiting signs of illness, especially if they have a fever. Also, you must call or email the office in the morning if your child is going to be absent, and please keep us posted on their well-being and potential return date to the classroom.

#### Allergy Season

As allergy season approaches, though allergies are not contagious, any child who is unable to function effectively in the classroom because of allergies should remain at home.

#### **Medications**

All medications for students including over-the-counter allergy medications must be presented to the office by parents. A parent must also complete a medication authorization form (available on our website or from the office) *before* ECS is allowed to administer any medication. Students are not permitted to carry medication to school.

Note: A doctor's signature is required for any "as needed medication" (allergy medicine, etc.) intended for use for 10 or more days.
